Write an acrostic e-safety poem to share the internet safety message with others.

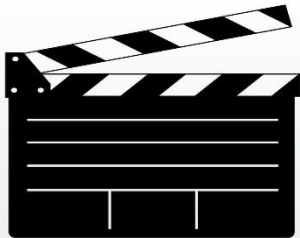
